





Here is a bit of an update about what our expectations are over the next few hours. The initial concern is near Fargo. Two supercells with a history of producing tornadoes are approaching Fargo. These storms are not expected to weaken over the next few hours. Therefore, a persistent tornado and hail threat will continue through at least midnight. Those in Fargo need to be monitoring these storms closely.


Further west, an approaching line of storms with **observed** winds of 80 to 100 MPH winds will impact the area at or after 11 PM. The orange area will see impacts first from this line. These are VERY DANGEROUS STORMS. This line will hold together further east, persisting well after midnight. (edited)

Partners: A VERY LARGE TORNADO is ONGOING east of Enderlin. Receiving multiple reports.

Also have a new tornado warning for Nelson, Griggs, Eddy into Steele counties. Radar indicates rotation in this area along the leading edge of the line. The environment remains VERY favorable for tornado spin ups along the leading edge of this line.



#### NWS - Grand Forks - Blake Rafferty 11:30 PM

Still getting tornado reports on that southern supercell leading the line. In addition to the west, we are seeing WIDESPREAD reports of 60 to 90 MPH gusts with this line of storms. Several new warnings have been issued to account for this. THESE ARE DANGEROUS STORMS!


The environment downstream would favor the line to turn a little more easterly then the northeast direction its traveling currently. Add in the storm interactions with the supercell ahead of the line, expect the line to deviate a bit in its direction/speed in the next couple of hours.







- FRIDAY (FIRST ALERT WEATHER DAY): Today is a First Alert Weather Day to include a more significant severe weather threat this evening into the overnight hours. Tornadoes, some strong, will be possible, mainly south of Hwy. 2. There is potential for significantly large hail- more than 2 in diameter. We also have the potential for significant damaging wind gusts of more than 75 mph.
- Since these will be overnight severe storms for some, it is more crucial that you have ways to receive alerts and warnings overnight. Now is a great time to download the Valley News Live W eather app if you don't already have it, and make sure you have notifications turned on! It's also a good idea to make sure you have your phone fully charged before you head to bed. If possible, park the car in the garage. Securing outdoor furniture, bringing in potted plants, and protecting the garden are also good ideas.
- SATURDAY SUNDAY: By Saturday, the storm track and upper-level ridge lifts north, bringing a lower chance for severe weather across our region, and more heat! However, If we can overcome warm air aloft, there is a risk of isolated severe storms. Temperatures will be in the 80s and 90s through the weekend.

#### Timeline - National Weather Service (Pre-Event) 6/20/2025

- W eather Alerts and information put out to the public regarding the risk of severe weather to include wind, up to 2 inch in diameter hail, 75+ mile wind, and risk of tornados for Cass County.
- National W eather Service puts out a Severe Thunderstorm W atch for Southwest and South Central,
   ND at 3:45 PM.
- National W eather Service notes at 7:17pm MDT NDAW N Station 10 miles Northwet of Elgin windgusts up to 94 mph.
- National W eather Service notes a supercell developed south of Jamestown and produced hail up to 3 inches in diameter. The storm moved Northeast and produced a tornado.
- National W eather Service notes around 9pm CDT a larger more damaging tornado formed 2 miles East-Northeast of Spiritwood and moved into Barnes County.
- National W eather Services notes a 2<sup>nd</sup> Supercell formed south of the initial storm moving Southeast through Stutsman and Lamoure Counties. This storm produced a tornado near Adrian and another North of Verona.

#### **NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE - TIMELINE**


National Weather Service reports that as the main line of storms moved into Eastern North Dakota a phenomenon known as a Mesoscale Convective Vortex developed on the Northern end of the bowing line of storms. This feasture is essentially a small-scale low pressure system that developed due to the intensity of the line of storms. The Mesoscale Convective Vortex that developed in this event was uniquely intense, and brought 1 to 2 hours of hurricane force winds to the areas of East Highway 83 and between Highway 200 and Interstate 94. The strongest gust associated with the Mesoscale Convective Vortex in central North Dakota was 99 MPH in Northern Kidder County.




#### Timeline - Cass County Dispatch 6/20/2025

- 6/20/2025 2117 Hours Documentation Storm Details Call for Service at I-94 Exit 307 caller said possible funnel clouds south of the Interstate. Heavy rain and lightning noted and power is flickering. Deputies responded to Tower City gas station to check on motorists and weather.
- 06/20/2025 2212 Hours Documentation Storm Details Call for Service from Cass County Deputies. Advised at gas station in Tower City said 30 travelers were there. Manager said they would keep the doors open. One traveler came in and said there was a tornado south of this location. Deputies requested Tower City Tornado sirens be set off again. Deputies could barely see outside but they could not see a tornado.
- 06/20/2025 at 2340 Hours (2025-20864) Structure Damage Call For Service from a person called Dispatch advising they were watching a live stream on YouTube that showed a tornado going through this intersection and Storm Chasers were live streaming it. He said a few buildings were destroyed and did not know if anyone was hurt. He was calling form Ohio. The intersection was 53<sup>rd</sup> St SE and 138<sup>th</sup> Ave SE Enderlin, ND.
- 06/20/2025 at 2345 Hours there was an Automatic Crash Alert Call For Service that came into dispatch on I-94 and MM332. State radio called and advised there was a semi flipped over east of mile marker 333 in the Eastbound lane. The driver's arm was bleeding and Highway Patrol would take this call.
- 06/20/2025 at 2347 Hours Davenport Fire called in **Documentation Storm Details Call for Service (2025-233)** advising there were funnel clouds west of **Davenport**. Information was broadcasted to Cass County Cars.
- 06/20/2025 at 2349 Hours Accident Call for Service to Red River Valley Dispatch at I-29 and Exit 78 (2025-11344) for an automatic crash alert. The caller was a semi driver advising his rig was tipped over at MM82. Sergeant Mcnamara responsed and marked with tape. He gave driver a ride to Fargo.
- 6/20/2025 2339 Hours Gas Leak Call for Service from T.P (2025-20865) at 13991 54<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin, ND for a gas leak. There were no injuries. He and wife went into bathroom. They have no car or anywhere to go. They are shaken up. It is raining heavily and their roof fell on their car. They cannot take shelter in their car. Corporal Hutton asked Enderlin Fire to be paged out due to gas at 007 hours. They called State Radio at 0009 hours. State was going to page them out as the POUR phone system was not working. At 0012 hours it was noted a Trooper was standing by if needed. The complainant was not answering, and they requested Alice Fire be paged out. Corporal Hutton was on his way but had to stop North side of Alice due to tree being on road. At 0026 hours Dispatch noted that Alice Fire was still asking to respond due to Enderlin Fire not responding to pages yet. Dispatched noted that contact with Corporal Hutton needs to be with phone as radio was not working, and powerlines are down. Dispatch noted at 0041 hours that there is a possible fire person Corporal Hutton was talking to regarding possible deceased individuals at or near 13991 54<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin. It was noted that there was one positive deceased at 0042 hours. At 0051 hours State Radio is sending CAD Mapping for Corporal Hutton showing 14019 54<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin. He noted at 0100 hours the propane tank leaking. Deputies advised the address was right off Highway 46 to the North. At 0114 hours he noted that a drone was flying over.

#### Timeline - Cass County Dispatch 6/21/2025

- 06/21/2025 at 0025 Hours (2025-20870) at 49<sup>th</sup> St SE and 139<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin there was a Call For Service for an Accident. A semi was tipped over on a gravel road, per State Radio. Corporal Hutton advised that there were downed power lines for about a mile and Dispatch would page out Enderlin Fire. Trooper checked the area and did not see the semi. State Radio notified about power lines over road.
- 06/21/2025 at 0107 Hours (2025-20872), there was a **Traffic Complaint** called in by Sergeant Canales regarding a lot of debris in the road and downed powerlines. The address was 54<sup>th</sup> St SE and 146 th Ave SE Enderlin.
- 06/21/2025 at 0111 Hours (2025-20873) Medical Call for Service at 5110 140<sup>th</sup> Ave SE Enderlin, ND for a possible deceased tornado victim and Enderlin Fire was on scene. Air Med was paged out for the trauma victim that was found. At 0149 Hours Information noted there was a downed power line blocking the route on 140<sup>th</sup> Ave SE. Coroner was in route to Enderlin Fire Hall, including Enderlin Fire and Lisbon Ambulance.
- 06/21/2025 at 0121 Hours it was Information Noted that Incident Command is at 13991 54<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin, ND. Ingress route was provided as going through State Highway 38 through Alice and to go east. It was noted that there were lots of power lines down.
- 6/21/2025 at 0107 Hours (2025-20872) there was a **Traffic Complaint** created for a lot of debris in roadway and downed powerlines. Address noted is 54<sup>th</sup> St SE and 146<sup>th</sup> Ave SE Enderlin.
- 06/21/2025 at 0127 Hours Information Noted that the nephew (we now know is T.P.) said that his aunt and uncle at the neighboring house were possibly deceased and he was too scared to check. The narrative pertaining to deceased is related to a possible tornado at 2025-20876 at 14019 54th St SE Enderlin.
- 06/21/2025 at 0154 Hours (2025-20875), at 201 Main Street Hunter, ND a Structure Damage Call for Service came in regarding the 1st Elevator Bin at the Hunter Elevator being down. Information Noted that there are downed powerlines at 1st Ave West (east of). At 0154 hours Deputy BUSHAW noted he arrived on scene and remained there until winds died down. He spoke with local officials to let them know about the power lines and damage.
- 06/21/2025 at 0149 Hours (2025-20877) at 343 4<sup>th</sup> Ave W Hunter, ND for a Public Assist Call for Service involving a concerned citizen. She was staying in her camper while her house was bering renovated and she was worried her camper was going to blow over. She was wondering if she should go to her house. She was told a structure is always safer.
- 06/21/2025 at 0150 Hours there was a Call for Service at 14019 54<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin as there were two deceased individuals. A Trooper was just pulling up to assist and was rerouted to the Enderlin Fire Hall. At 0234 hours there was a manual page sent for the drone team response. At 0239 Hours Information Noted that there were downed power lines at. Highway 46 and County Road 7.



#### Storm Damage 2025-20865 13991 54th St SE Enderlin, ND





Enderlin couple survived the tornado likely due to type of construction on their home as well as a weather emergency alert they received, prompting them to go into an interior bathroom right before it hit their home. Their relatives and neighbors did not survive the storm.



## Storm Damage With 1 Fatality - 2025-20873 5110 140<sup>th</sup> Ave SE Enderlin, ND



This farm belonged to an elderly Enderlin couple. The wife was in Enderlin for a family reunion so she was not home when the storm hit. The husband was home when the storm hit and had talked with his wife over the phone saying the weather was getting kind of bad.

Medical intervention was attempted by First Responders but the husband did not survive.

#### Timeline - Cass County Dispatch 6/21/2025

- Cass County Deputies started a Grid Search (Search and Rescue) to determine if any other residents needed assistance. The following notes are regarding the searches:
  - At 0402 Hours all residents accounted for and no issues at 5331 141 st Ave SE.
  - At 0423 Hours no answer but no apparent damage at 5162 143rd Ave SE.
  - At 0429 Hours that there was no answer and no apparent damage at 5150 143<sup>rd</sup> Ave SE Enderlin
  - At **0429 Hours** there was a dog on the porch a vehicle in the garage and no answer at the previous address.
  - At 0442 Hours there was no answer and no damage noted at 4925 142<sup>nd</sup> Ave SE.
  - At **0454 Hours** they contacted the homeowner and there were no issues at **5220 142**nd **Ave SE**.
  - At 0457 Hours there was no answer and no damage noted at 5242 142<sup>nd</sup> Ave SE.
  - At 0503 Hours there was no answer and no damage at 5268 142<sup>nd</sup> Ave SE.
  - At 0507 Hours there was severe damage and the vehicle is under the garage at 14050 52nd St SE.
  - At 0522 Hours there was light damage and no injuries at 14006 52<sup>nd</sup> St SE.
  - At **0150 Hours** there is severe damage with the older home being removed from the concrete foundation and spread to the North. Scattered wood, uplifted trees, and trees snapped off from the base were observed. There was significant damage noted to this farm and two deceased were located by Storm Chasers. Chasers placed green marking tape where they located the deceased and covered the people for respect. Incident Command set up at this location. At **1159 Hours** on 06/21/2025 the National Weather Service was on scene to survey this property.
- 06/21/2025 at 0201 Hours a Traffic Hazard Call for Service came in regarding a tree blocking the road at Main St and 139<sup>th</sup> Ave SE Buffalo. The road was completely impassable.
   The NDDOT and State Radio were notified.
- 06/21/2025 at 0232 Hours Information Noted that the City of Arthur was Without Power. There were downed trees at various locations. There were large tree braches in the southbound lane by 6<sup>th</sup> Ave and Main St blocking the roadway.
- 06/21/2025 at 0254 Hours (2025-20882) Information Noted on Traffic Hazard that there was a down tree near the intersection of Chaffee Ave and Miller St. Structures appear to be in tact and power appears to be on in town.
- 06/21/2025 0301 Hours Utility Information Noted powerline down in complainants back yard. At 0315 hours Cass County Electric on scene. At 0332 City Workers were out and attempting to clean streets. Call location was 130 1st Ave Arthur, ND.

#### Timeline - Cass County Dispatch 06/21/2025

- 06/21/2025 at 0558 Hours (2025-20894) there was a Utility Call for Service at 162<sup>nd</sup> Ave SE and 51<sup>st</sup> St SE Kindred, ND for a power pole partially blown over. Ottertail Power notified.
- 06/21/2025 at 0642 Hours there was a Call for Service at 136<sup>th</sup> Ave SE and 54<sup>th</sup> St SE Enderlin for a Train Derailment. There were 18 cars overturned near the refinery. The address is 136<sup>th</sup> Ave SE just north of the oil refinery on their off track.
- 06/21/2025 at 0647 Hours 16151 52<sup>nd</sup> St SE Kindred Traffic Hazard Call for Service for a tree blocking road. Made contact with City Maintenance and it was removed.
- 06/21/2025 at 0659 Hours 155th Ave SE / 23rd St SE Arthur, ND (2025-20889) Utility Call for Service for a power line down out in the field. Ottertail power notified.
- 06/21/2025 0701 Hours Main St / 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave Buffalo, ND (2025-20890) Traffic Hazard Call for Service for a tree down blocking county road 10. Road Department was able to remove the tree and cut it up.
- 06/21/2025 at 0722 Hours 4th St and Clement Ave Grandin, ND (2025-20892) Damage Report Call for Service for a tree fell onto the car. They were able to get the car out.
- 06/21/2025 at 0749 Hours (2025-20901) Call for Service for a caller requesting Welfare Check on his father was told by neighbor that their house is gone and they have passed. Call transferred to Sheriff Jahner and Detective Gress.
- 06/21/2025 0758 Hours 16625 18<sup>th</sup> St SE Gardner, ND (2025-20903) Utility / Public Assist Call for Service for a complainant has no power and is unable to open the gate at the end of the drive. Neighbor helped pry the gate open and resident was going to go stay with daughter.
- 06/21/2025 0759 Hours Pearl St N and 1st Ave E Buffalo ND (2025-20899) Traffic Hazard Call for Service for trees down in the roadway here. Moved without issue.
- 06/21/2025 0804 Hours (2025-20900) 200 2<sup>nd</sup> St E Hunter, ND Traffic Hazard Call for Service for multiple power lines down, trees on roads, Hunter Fire not responding to radio, Arthur Fire paged out at 0812. Page received on both.

- 06/21/2025 at 0859 Hours 113 3<sup>rd</sup> St Hickson (2025-20909) Traffic Hazard Call for Service for line is not arcing or sparking but is across the street. Complainant has already contacted the power company. Complainant was concerned someone will hit it and run over it. The cable was broken and connected to a pole and the end of the sable was in a bush. It was not sparking but was a small traffic hazard due to the cable hanging over the road. Fire Department arrived on scene and took over.
- 06/21/2025 at 0905 Hours (2025-20911) Call for Service for a Welfare Check was conducted at 106 4<sup>th</sup> Ave Ayr, ND. There was a large tree that fell and landed on what appears to be chicken coup. The trailer was not damaged at all. The couple had stayed elsewhere last night anticipating the storm and reported no injuries or damages to other parts of the property.
- 06/21/2025 at 0912 Hours (2025-20913) Call for Service for a Welfare Check. No notes.
- 06/21/2025 0927 Hours (2025-20914) Call for Service for a Welfare Check 320 Main St Arthur, ND. No notes.
- 06/21/2025 0932 Hours (2025-20914) Call for Service Welfare Check 410 3<sup>rd</sup> St Ayr. Deputies stopped to see how people were doing after they saw them outside taking photos of their home. They reported a tree struck their garage on the SW corner. They allowed him to come on the property and take some photos for logging purposes. Man he spoke to said he may have seen a tornado touchdown just to SE Ayr.







**Summary:** The first tornado began 3 miles south of Enderlin and tracked to the northeast, then north across highway 46, and finally to the northwest where it weakened and dissipated. This tornado was on the ground for around 12 miles, and at its widest was about one mile wide. Damage indicators along the path of this tornado correlates to EF-3 damage, with peak winds estimated to be around 160 mph. EF-3 damage was noted along about 7.5 miles of the total path.

The damage began as just a few branches but within 2.5 miles of the track, the tornado gained intensity and significantly widened. W hile south of Highway 46, the tornado derailed several train cars and threw one train car approximately 300 feet. Additionally, a cell tower was blown over, crops destroyed, and many large trees snapped with some debarked. A farm house was leveled with many outbuildings destroyed. As the tornado moved north of Highway 46, it caused devastating damage to two houses, one being a farmhouse that was leveled and led to 2 fatalities. The tornado continued north, causing tree damage and eventually leveling another farm house, leading to 1 fatality. As

the tornado moved to the northwest, it bent over tall steel electrical transmission towers, and then eventually weakened and dissipated.

**Summary:** A second tornado developed from the same supercell thunderstorm about 4 miles northeast of Enderlin and tracked to the southeast, crossed Highway 46, and then weakened and dissipated. This tornado was on the ground for around 8 miles, at its widest was about a half mile wide. Damage indicators along the path of this tornado correlates to EF-1 damage, with peak winds estimated to be

around 110 mph.

Along the path of this tornado was extensive tree damage, including trees snapped and uprooted. Several roofs were partially blown apart as well. This tornado crossed the path of the first tornado which is evidenced by drone footage showing field scour marks in different directions.




## **Navigating Scene Hazards During Recovery Efforts**









#### Derecho

The derecho portion of this severe event tracked from west to east across North Dakota during the evening hours, with widespread wind gusts over 60 mph, with some locations gusting over 100 mph. As the derecho moved into eastern North Dakota, it caught up with the tornadic supercell storms. The northern portion of the derecho weakened as it moved into Minnesota, but the southern portion regained strength and moved across portions of Minnesota through the early morning hours. Extensive damage was reported, especially in areas that gusted over 100 mph.

Cass County Sheriff's Office Responds to Tornado Fatalities in Rural Enderlin

CASS COUNTY, N.D. (June 21, 2025)—At approximately 11:40 p.m. on 06/20/25, the Cass County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to rural Enderlin for tornado damage to a residence. Once deputies arrived on the scene, the Enderlin Fire Department let them know that storm chasers had located two deceased people as a result of the tornado. Shortly after learning of this, the Enderlin Fire Department was dispatched to another location, and a third deceased person was found as a result of the tornado. Deputies found extensive damage to the area and began conducting well-being checks on people with several partner agencies. Law enforcement, the Enderlin Fire Department, and other first responders continue searching the area and checking on residents now.

The Cass County Sheriff's Office continues to work through the specifics of this incident as this investigation moves forward. Sheriff Jahner will hold a press conference in the Northeast corner of County Road 38 and Highway 46 at 7:30 a.m.







# North Dakota Disaster Declaration & Request For Federal Aid

- North Dakota Governor Kelly Armstrong declared a statewide disaster on June 21<sup>st</sup> in response to the June 20<sup>th</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> 2025 storms. There were 4 storm related deaths, 37,000 people without power, and significant property damage.
- July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2025 North Dakota Governor Kelly Armstrong requested presidential declaration from FEMA following the severe June storm. He seeks federal aid for 19 North Dakota counties that experienced significant damage from the storms including infrastructure and loss of life.
- Affected counties include: Barnes, Burleigh, Cass, Eddy, Emmons, Foster, Grant, Griggs, Kidder, Mclean, Morton, Oliver, Ransom, Sheridan, Sioux, Steele, Stutsman, Traill, and Wells.
  - O Highest damage amounts include: Oliver County (2.6 Million), Cass County (1.5 Million), Barnes County (1.3 Million) and Stutsman County (1.1 Million).
- Preliminary damage estimates are approximately 11.5 million.

- Federal relief is requested pursuant to section 401 of the Robert T. Stafford
   Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act.
- Governor Armstrong issued Executive Order 2025-05 which activated our State Emergency Operations Plan to mobilize all available state resources to ensure a coorindated response to help impacted communities.
- Governor Armstrong stated in his letter that the most devastating tornado was documented near the City of Enderlin with wind speeds near 160 mph. It carved a 12 mile path of devastation as it leveled multiple farmhouses and led to 3 fatalities. The acting Emergency Manager Brady Schriber advised that agricultural sites and farmsteads sustained significant damage including destroyed grain bins, irrigation systems and power lines. Cass County Sheriff Jesse Jahner told reporters that the storm was still active when they (first responders) responded and was very dangerous.

### Governor Armstrongs Request For Aid Letter Continued

- Many of the hardest hit homesteads were in deeply rural areas that do not have storm siren systems and these elements likely contributed to this tragic outcome.
- The City of Page was without power for 6 days and a Cass County Emergency Management Generator was used to power the City's Command Center being used for Emergency Operations. A rented generator was also brought to power the Page Public School which was being used as an emergency shelter and feeding station. Hunter also used a rentered generator to provide their community with an emergency shelter. Schribner advised, "We needed the generators not only for safety but for survival."
- Jim Heidorn, Mayor of Page, told the AP that wind ravaged trees, roofs, and structures, stating, "Half of the town's tree's are gone."
- Transportation was also severely impacted as key roadways such as I-94 and I-29 were impacted or closed temporarily due to overturned semi trucks or vehicles that blocked the lanes of traffick.

- There were also three train derailments across the state. One near Enderlin (Cass / Ransom Counties) involving 12 empty train tanker cars, a second one near Galesburg (SW Trail County) involving 3 miles of empty grain cars (nearly 300 unites off the track), and a third one near Mayville (Traill County) which involved 6 to 7 mile long trail hauling loaded grain cars which was pushed off the track.
- The ND W atch Center was monitoring conditions and disseminating updated through W ebEOC and other communication channels.
- The ND Department of Emergency Services activated the State Emergency Operations Plan (SEOP) to help assist local officials with recovery and restroration services.
- Emergency Disaster Declarations were also made for the City of Hunter, the City of Page, and Cass County.
- Schribner stated, "We coordinated generator deliveries, command center support, debris removal and public information outreach, all while trying to track costs and needs in real time. We did everything we could, but we've hit our ceiling."

### Governor Armstrong's Letter Requesting Aid Continued

- Cass County and City of Fargo Communication Teams boosted messaging from community leaders in Hunter, Page, and Erie who were seeking volunteers.
- Cass County also hosted daily recovery meetings to share updates, identify needs, report damages and address ongoing impacts.
- One local business coordinated roughly 100 volunteers to support the community of Enderlin.
- Community members also donated water, drinks, snacks and supplies to volunteers.
- The ND Forest Service (NDFS) activated 5 wildland firefighters with chainsaw certification to help break down debris for removal in the community of Hunter. Firefighters were focused on breaking down large trees to better manage safety concerns.
- The ND Department of Transportation (NDDOT) monitored incident updates for road closures, worth with local district offices to assess damage, and provided manual labor support for debris removal.
- The NDDEQ worked with local landfill managers to ensure that appropriate procuedures were followed for disposal and provide technical assistance for hazardous chemical spills.
- The ND based Rural Electric Cooperatives (RECs), Transmission Organizations and Investor Owned Utilities worked nonstop to perform emergency repairs to restore electricity to all impacted residents.

- The ND Dept of Health and Human Services activated its Department Operations Center (DOC) contacting health care facitilities to understand where the power outages existed. Following this outreach NDHHS mobiled refrigerated trucks and gnerators to several long-term care facilities and one human service center across the state.
- NDHHS also coordinated with SNAP to replace lost food caused by extended power outages for residents who rely on the Snap Program.
- Fargo Cass Public Health mobiles a generator to Page Public School where the ARC established respite care.
- ARC staff and volunteers activated the shelter which provided warm showers, phone
  charging stations, snacks, water, recovery resources and damage assessments upon
  request. They also hosted a community meal and navigated requests for short-term
  housing and financial assistances.
- The NW S provided critical technical support before, during and after the disaster offering warnings and post-event analysis that supported response and recover operations.
- The NDDES coordinated with the Join Information Center to proactively share recovery resources to citizes on Ndresponse.gov website.

### **CCSO AFTER ACTION FEEDBACK - COMMUNICATION**

- As with any major incident there was communication issues in the beginning. Whether it was from the radios/lines being down, a breakdown in communication, Deputies / 1st Responders not getting all of the information or confusion over where things were happening or what happened.

  Deputies did there best to work through it. The breakdown in communication did lead to Deputies wasting a good amount of time looking for a child they believed was at one of the scenes (there was no child) and trying to find a tornado victim at their home when they were brought to the Enderlin Firehall.
- During this event the radio communication system was not functioning well due to downed power lines / radio tower damage. Radios and phones did not work in Enderlin which presented a challenge for responders. Outside of Enderlin the portable radios were not working the best therefore
   Deputies switched to using cell phones and CAD. One Deputy even suggested that a supervisor log in to his BWC so he could see what was going on as he could not communicate over the radio. This problem led to Law Enforcement not being able to get assets where they were needed to quicker.
  - O If we needed additional radio support we believe there is a radio "Mobile Power Box" that may be stored in Detroit Lakes and is pulled by trailer that could help but it is quite a distance away and it would take a resource to go pick it up. Researching or brainstorming with Brian at RRVDC may be beneficial to find a workaround in the event coms went down in larger areas and a fix would be needed.

### CCSO AFTER ACTION FEEDBACK - RESOURCES / IC

- Deputies did not have enough resources to manage the incident and had to call in additional assistance. The Sheriff, Patrol Captain, Investigative Sergeant, On-Call Investigator, and a Field Sergeant came out to assist. They attempted to call in additional investigative staff however they were unable to get ahold of them.
  - As a fix they met with the members they could not get ahold of and came up with a possible solution of using Everbridge for call outs.
  - Also while Deputies were responding on the ingress routes (all had downed lines over them) they ran over downed power lines. It would be beneficial to have a class or education on power lines and what companies do to mark them if they are not electrified. What is safe and not safe?

- Incident Command was established close to where it is believed that the tornado entered Cass County and also the location believed to have the most devastation (2 deceased). There were several entities represented at Incident Command. We really felt the gap of not having an Enderlin Fire Representative there as part of Unified Command to help with communication between all responders.
- W hen Deputies were performing a grid search looking for other victims or damage I don't think they were marking the residences off at the location. They were in the Command Truck but if another responder went to check there would be no indication this property was checked. Do Deputies have the training to know how to mark the properties as checked if need be during a major incident? If not it may be beneficial to bring that training in. It is taught in a FEMA course.

### CCSO AFTER ACTION FEEDBACK - RECOVERY

- Cass County's Emergency Manager retired prior to this storm event and the only other Emergeny Management employee was on vacation out of state when this incident happened. This employee had Brady Schriber with Fargo Emergency Management filling in. Given this was a retirement it would have been adventagous to have a new Emergency Manager hired and trained prior to the other one retiring. This likely would have allowed for better overall management of this incident from the County, which these small communities really rely on for guidance / leadership.
- In a community recovery meeting a member of the Red Cross mostly shared the things they could not assist with and when asked about the possibility of them assisting with getting water to the town they mentioned that Costco delivered. It may be beneficial to visit with them beforehand to find out what their capabilities are, resources they can provide, and what the extent of their resources are (given multiple communities were impacted).
- Some of the smaller contract communities did not seem to have an Emergency Operations Plan/Preparedness for a major event such as this. It would be beneficial for these communities to have their community leaders to attend Emergency Prepardness Training as well as to come up with an Emergency Prepardness Plan (if they do not have one) before an event to better help them during the incident as well as during recovery. If they do have a plan or looking to create a plan it should include:
  - A place for residents to have access to water for hydration or showers. Suggestions may be a school or firehall.
  - A place identified that will have electricity (running generator) for those that rely on it.
  - A place for residents to go to get information if communication methods were still down and a place to store donations.
  - A place for residents to go that will have food/water/refrigeration for medications.
  - A predetermined location or collection point in the event someone needed medical but lines are down.
  - Having a volunteer sign up sheet put in place at the beginning of the incident.

### **CCSO Deputy Comments**

<u>Deputy R.H. (Assistant Supervisor On Patrol Shift & Training a New Deputy)</u>—The initial and secondary response was to be expected with the storm (delays, debris in road, etc.). Only thing to note would be to have a Chaplin and or resource on site with Incident Command should any need the resource; to include involved family, responders, and/or citizens. I know a majority on scene were asked if it was needed; but the ability to have the resource on site for an immediate use could be beneficial if someone was truly struggling with an incident. He advised that this maybe the only thing he could think of that was not present.

Deputy H.H. (Responding Investigator On-Call) - l liked having the crime scene truck there.

<u>Deputy M.C. (Responding Supervisor in Agency Called Out To Assist)</u>—I think the overall event response went very well. From the time of callout for me, hearing the events unfold over the radio, I think our response was timely and appropriate. I think all responding units did well and responded in a timely manner. Once on scene all assets worked together to search for any further victims.

Deputy T. M. (Supervisor on Shift): Based upon the whole response to the IC locations and resources that came out, I personally believe this agency did an amazing job. No one can really prepare for something like this but more or less be ready just in case. Based on every aspect of CCSO everyone did such an amazing job with what we had to work with. Overcoming and adapting to the situation – Search and Rescue, Grid Searchs, Going Door to Door, Drone Operations, Command Truck, Well Ran ICS, Investigations/Ground Units, Communication with additional resources... this was a phenomenal job.

<u>Deputy T. J (Responding Investigator Supervisor Called to Assist):</u> I feel like Deputies did a great job working through this critical incident with loss of life. They recognized that the situation called for additional resources and appropriately requested them. They worked through communication issues, scene hazards, and weather that was likely a danger to their own lives. I do think having the Command Truck out there was beneficial for overall operations and to coordinate investigative activities. The CCSO response to this incident is a testament to the Emergency Prepardness, Planning, Training, and Leadership in the office.












Wind Gusts of 60-75 mph, RH around 25%, Temps in the 60s F




### A Strong Cold Frontal Passage and High Winds



Percent of Normal Precipitation (%) 7/1/2024 - 9/30/2024




D2 Severe Drought D3 Extreme Drought



### Williston, North Dakota Monthly Precipitation




Number of Consecutive Days Since 0.50" or More of Precipitation: 95




