

Summary of Responses




#### County-Reported Challenges with 3% Cap


- Road and infrastructure projects: Many counties cited difficulty maintaining or expanding road systems due to budget constraints.
- **Health insurance and benefits:** Rising costs are a major concern, especially when counties can't increase budgets to match.
- **Use of reserves**: Several counties are depleting reserves to maintain services, which is unsustainable long-term.
- **Staffing challenges**: Limited ability to offer competitive wages or hire additional staff is affecting service delivery.
- **Equipment and capital projects**: Counties are deferring or canceling purchases of essential equipment and vehicles.

Did you use reserves to cover 2026 budget expenses? 36 responses




#### Amount of Cap Percentage to Carry Forward




## Confidence in Meeting Residents Needs

#### Looking Forward — Suggested Legislative Tweaks

- Review cap calculation method and possible exemptions for essential services.
- Consider phased implementation or targeted aid for smaller/rural counties.
- Impact to Home Rule counties with voter approved levy authority.
- State reimbursement for state mandated expenses (elections, assessment notices, publications).
- Simplified method for increasing cap for state-mandated services, infrastructure failures, emergencies.
- Cap that reflects inflation.
- Expand cap exemptions to include election costs, road levies, fire and ambulance service, correctional centers, employee health insurance.
