Chronology-Mohamad Barakat

- 1986: Born in Syria
- 2011: Dentist in Syria
- 2012: Enters U.S. via Syrian passport, files asylum application and resides in Fargo
- 2013-2018: Granted asylum and works as a dental assistant in MN
- •2/2021: Unable to pass certification test to be a dentist, turns to over the road truck driving



Chronology-Mohamad Barakat

- •7/2021: FBI Guardian referral re: concerns re: firearms/ammunition & mental stability; possibly a future mass shooter and dislike of the LGBTQ community.
 - $^{\circ}\,$ investigated and all legal, no actionable conduct, FBI concurs
- 12/2021: U.S. Naturalized Citizen
- 9/2022: Fire at his apartment in Fargo, leads to police contact re: firearms/ammunition, investigated and all legal; he moves out of apartment to another Fargo location
- •6/2023: Fired from trucking job after on-duty crash; ongoing mental health and relational issues

7/9-7/13/23: Computer searches re: unemployed, suicide, mass shootings, upcoming Fargo events

Chronology-Officer-Involved Critical Incident

•7/14/23: Officer Jake Wallin starts his shift @ 6am w/Police Training Officer Zachary Robinson

2:42pm: Accident occurs at 9th Ave. S & 25th St. S

•2:49pm: Police Training Officer Andrew Dotas & his trainee Officer Tyler Hawes arrive and request assistance, Jake & Zach respond

2:53pm-3:01pm: Barakat is driving around area, stopping intermittently and ultimately parks @
825 25th St. S

• This location is elevated from the street in which the officers and a civilian are investigating the accident

• The second car involved with multiple occupants, unwittingly parks next to Barakat's vehicle

3:04pm: As Officer's Dotas, Hawes, and Wallin approach second vehicle, Barakat opens fire striking all three officers and then exits car shooting civilian

- Officer Robinson engages from the roadway, approximately 70 feet away and ultimately stops the threat after a 2 minute gun battle.
- Officer Wallin gets off one shot before being fatally struck.





Overdoses rose drastically in 2020 and 2021, likely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Total overdoses increased 161% from 2019 to 2020; and continued to increase another 57% from 2020 to 2021 (Figure 1). While 2021 shows the highest number of fatal overdoses, the overall percentage of fatal overdoses is continuing to trend downward, likely due to the availability and frequency of Narcan administration (Figure 2).










2023 YTD OVERDOSE STATS CONTINUED


